4. FIRST AID MEASURES

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General advice

Move out of dangerous area. Remove contaminated clothing immediately and dispose of safely.

Skin contact

Wash off thoroughly with plenty of soap and water, if available with polyethyleneglycol 400, subsequently rinse with water.

Eye contact

In case of eye contact, remove contact lens and rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

Ingestion

Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth, ingest activated charcoal. Obtain medical attention.

Notes to physician

Symptoms

Nausea, Vomiting, Diarrhoea, Salivation, If large amounts are ingested, the following symptoms may occur:, abnormally decreased blood volume (hypovolaemia), acidosis, Liver disorders, Kidney disorders

Treatment

Gastric lavage is not normally required. However, if a significant amount (more than a mouthful) has been ingested, administer activated charcoal and sodium sulphate. Treat symptomatically.

There is no specific antidote.
